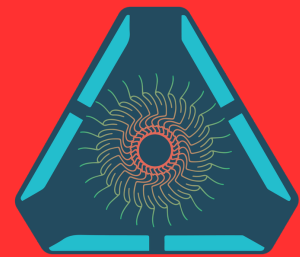

SVANITI'S OVERVIEW

ORIGIN

SvaNiti Policy Research Center is an independent, people-centric policy think tank dedicated to syncing national aspirations into actionable policy, with a core focus on education renewal and nation-building aligned to Viksit Bharat 2047. The organization emerged from a seven-year grassroots education experiment that began with Insight Academy and evolved into the IDUME Education System (2020), which sought to bridge opportunity gaps between Tier-1 and Tier-2/3 schooling through Bhartiya values and learner-led exploration. Recognizing that meaningful scale requires systemic reform, SvaNiti Policy Research Center was formally incorporated in 2021.

VISION

The vision of SvaNiti—"Inspiring Aspirations, Designing Policy, Building Nation"—anchors three core commitments: rethinking the policy-making process, rejuvenating education with Indic ideas, and contributing as a vital cog to Viksit Bharat. The organization aspires to build Bharat's largest idea repository, designed to turn people's aspirations into policy pathways. Flagship initiatives such as the Sva-Bharat Movement and LifeSite conceptualization reflect a philosophy that transformation begins as a movement, not merely as a policy, and that education must evolve beyond conventional institutions to address contemporary needs.

APPROACH

SvaNiti follows a people-up, not paper-down approach—placing citizen aspirations at the core of policy research. By blending grassroots insights, Indic knowledge systems, and structured advocacy, the organization translates lived experiences into actionable proposals. Its methodology combines movement-building, institutional design, and non-partisan engagement to bridge the gap between communities and governance.

LIFESITE CONCEPTUALIZATION

The idea of a university originates from the Sanskrit word Vishvavidyalaya—literally, “the abode of all knowledge of the universe.” Historically, this signified a space where one could access and explore the entirety of human and cosmic wisdom. But in today’s world, where information is abundant and instantly accessible, what learners truly need is not the knowledge of the entire universe, but a space to understand **life as it is**.

LifeSite emerges from this conviction. It is not designed as another institution to deliver predefined courses, but as a living ecosystem where learners cultivate reflection, curiosity, and wisdom through direct experiences. Rather than treating education as accumulation, LifeSite emphasizes exploration, meaning-making, and conscious living—anchored in the belief that education must prepare individuals not just for livelihood, but for life itself.

After seven years of experimentation through IDUME—our pilot in learner-led exploration and alternative pedagogy—we have decided to conclude active operations by June 2025. The year ahead will be dedicated to conceptualizing the LifeSite Research Document, a synthesis of our field learnings, cohort experiences, and pedagogical innovations. This document will serve as a blueprint for future models of education that aspire to be relevant to our times, rooted in both Bharatiya wisdom and contemporary realities.

SVA-BHARAT MOVEMENT



The Sva-Bharat Movement is the flagship citizen-led initiative of SvaNiti Policy Research Center, rooted in our belief that policy must rise from people's aspirations, not descend from paper-based assumptions. This movement evolved from our early explorations in education—where we realized that students, educators, and communities must be seen not only as beneficiaries but as stakeholders and leaders in shaping education policy. Since 2019, alongside our IDUME experiments, we engaged schools, colleges, and regional actors to listen, document, and translate their ideas into policy pathways.

***** Building momentum through grassroots mobilization, where regional representatives and campus ambassadors capture ideas from institutions and communities, funnel them into our repository, and incubate, scale, or formulate them for accessibility to the last mile.

***** Collecting inputs from stakeholders, filtering ideas through consultations, drafting notional proposals, and sharing them with ministries, departments, and public representatives.

This framework ensures that every idea is nurtured—from aspiration to implementation. By combining the rigor of a think tank with the energy of a civic movement, the Sva-Bharat Movement is steadily becoming Bharat's largest repository of policy-relevant ideas. It allows SvaNiti to act as both an incubator and a bridge: scaling ideas, consulting with subject experts, and positioning them within governance structures.

At its core, the Sva-Bharat Movement reflects our conviction that every great impact in India has always come through a movement—and policy-making for a Viksit Bharat must be no different. As we advance, we will make our approach to this project more clear, structured, and measurable, ensuring that the process itself sets new benchmarks for participatory policy-making.



NOTION OF MINISTRY OF CREATIVE ECONOMY AFFAIRS

The Creative Economy Project at SvaNiti Policy Research Center focuses on institutionalizing creativity as a driver of jobs, exports, and inclusion. By mapping seven sectors and thirty-five industries, the project highlights how India's cultural heritage, creative talent, and innovation potential can be transformed into a strategic pillar of economic growth and global influence.

As part of the Good Governance Yatra 2024, we presented a Creative Economy Framework for Uttar Pradesh to Shri Asim Arun, Hon'ble Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Social Welfare, Government of Uttar Pradesh. The framework emphasized connecting traditional arts with modern markets, strengthening tourism infrastructure, and fostering creative entrepreneurship.

We also shared our draft proposal with Shri O. P. Choudhary, Hon'ble Finance Minister of Chhattisgarh, who expressed interest in considering it during state budget discussions.

A dedicated Ministry of Creative Economy Affairs remains central to this vision, ensuring coherence, institutional backing, and long-term investment in India's creative industries.

POLICY BOOTCAMP '24

What began with hesitation evolved into an enriching experience of over 100 hours of intensive learning, guided by more than 45 eminent speakers and policy leaders. The program provided exposure to diverse perspectives on governance, public leadership, and policy design.

The engagement was further strengthened by the support of mentors and curators who ensured an immersive learning environment. Key speakers—including policymakers, thought leaders, and academicians—contributed invaluable insights that deepened our understanding of India's public policy landscape.

Equally important was the opportunity to collaborate and exchange ideas with fellow participants, fostering a spirit of learning and purposeful dialogue. This milestone reflects our continued emphasis on learning beyond boundaries and reaffirming our commitment to leadership through policy and education.

We extend heartfelt gratitude to Rishihood University and Rashtram School of Public Leadership for creating a platform that enables such transformative experiences.



PUNE POLICY MEET-UP



In 2024, the Svaniti Policy Research Center organized an extensive and focused meetup that brought together a wide array of policy professionals, enthusiasts, and experts from diverse backgrounds in the vibrant city of Pune. This gathering aimed to provide a conducive environment for meaningful and in-depth dialogue on the emerging policy challenges facing our society today.

Participants engaged in discussions that not only highlighted the pressing issues at hand but also explored innovative opportunities for collaborative solutions. The event allowed for the exchange of ideas, fostering a deeper understanding of complex policy landscapes and encouraging the development of comprehensive strategies to address these challenges effectively.

The discussions highlighted diverse perspectives on policy-making and offered valuable reflections on Svaniti's approach to research, community engagement, and impact-driven initiatives. The exchange of ideas not only strengthened our regional presence in Maharashtra but also reinforced the importance of building a strong community of practice in policy research and innovation.



SCHOOLS OF TOMORROW SUMMIT

In August 2024, Svaniti Policy Research Center participated in the Schools of Tomorrow Summit in Pune, an educator convening that brought together nearly 200 school leaders, educators, and innovators from India and abroad. The summit aimed to catalyze transformative practices for future-ready schools by reimagining learning beyond traditional rote methods.



The program featured masterclasses, workshops, insight panels, a rapid prototyping hackathon, keynote sessions, and exhibits, all centered around themes of equity, school culture, and the responsible integration of AI in education. Sessions such as “Equity and Reinvention,” “Building a Culture of Learning and Innovation,” “Disruptions through AI: Impact on Learners,” and a Student Leaders Forum on Nation-Building enabled cross-institutional dialogue and practical exchange on pedagogy, leadership, and implementation strategies.

For Svaniti, the summit reinforced three urgent priorities for education reform:

1. Creativity and Innovation – fostering spaces where students can explore passions and think beyond conventional boundaries.
2. Agency and Ownership – enabling learners to take charge of their educational journeys.
3. Social-Emotional Well-being – ensuring that schools nurture supportive environments where every student feels valued and resilient.

Engagements with partners such as The Circle India, Teach For India, The Akanksha Foundation, and iTeach Schools further underscored the pivotal role of leadership in driving teacher effectiveness and student outcomes. The summit renewed our institutional commitment to advocate for equity-driven, innovative, and learner-centered education policies that prepare young people for the challenges of tomorrow.



GUJARAT YOUNG THINKERS MEET

In August 2024, Svaniti Policy Research Center participated in the 8th Young Thinkers Meet in Gujarat, which convened scholars, practitioners, and thought leaders around the theme of “Forgotten Indian Knowledge Systems.” Over three days, the discussions explored how traditional educational, cultural, economic, and environmental practices can be reinterpreted to address contemporary policy challenges. The meet highlighted sessions on education, festivals, economic models, traditional sports, environmental stewardship, and family values, while the Youth Parliament simulation deepened participants’ understanding of legislative processes through a debate on the Indian Knowledge Systems Preservation and Promotion Bill. For Svaniti, this engagement reaffirmed the importance of grounding policy thinking in India’s civilizational ethos. The experience provided valuable insights for designing innovative frameworks that integrate traditional wisdom with contemporary governance and development needs.



One of the most profound takeaways from the meet was Dr. Mala Kapadia’s session on the Bharatiya Education System. Her reflections on the “4 Es Crisis”—Economics, Emotional, Ecological, and Ethical—resonated deeply with our team and directly informed the foundation plots for the Education Policy currently being developed at Svaniti.

The session emphasized the true purpose of education: enabling human beings to evolve consciously, develop a worldview, cultivate character virtues, and define a way of life. Discussions also covered the competence of teachers, rooted in intent and self-mastery, and the competence of students, defined by curiosity, self-discipline, and the practice of “question-centered learning.” Importantly, she contrasted Western educational thought—which assumes a child is born with nothing—with the Bharatiya perspective, which holds that knowledge is already within the child, waiting to be drawn out. This perspective reinforced Svaniti’s commitment to reimagining education not as rote knowledge acquisition but as a holistic journey of self-discovery and societal contribution.



In August 2024, Svaniti Policy Research Center participated in Charcha 2024, India's largest livelihoods summit hosted by The/Nudge Institute. The three-day convening placed education—particularly school-to-work transitions, vocational skilling, and inclusion—at the heart of India's pathways to employment and entrepreneurship by 2047. With policymakers, social entrepreneurs, educators, and industry leaders in attendance, the summit advanced actionable roadmaps to align the National Education Policy (NEP 2020) with employability outcomes at scale. Key discussions addressed vocational strands in secondary schooling, apprenticeships and internships, recognition of prior learning, women's workforce participation, and the role of digital infrastructure and AI in personalized learning and job-matching. For Svaniti, these dialogues were pivotal in framing education not only as a social good but also as the backbone of India's livelihoods strategy.

Beyond plenary sessions, Charcha 2024 provided an invaluable platform for exchange with social entrepreneurs and grassroots leaders. Conversations ranged from enabling girls' participation in sports (Her Courage is Legendary) and creative literacy interventions (Letters for Change), to candid reflections on CSR, government partnerships, and innovative approaches to implementing NEP on the ground. These interactions reaffirmed Svaniti's belief that education policy is inseparable from livelihoods, social inclusion, and community resilience.

Our participation underscored Svaniti's role in bridging policy design with lived realities—listening, learning, and contributing to a collective vision where education leads to dignity, opportunity, and sustainable livelihoods for all.



PAFI 11TH ANNUAL FORUM



Svaniti Policy Research Center participated in the 11th Annual Forum of the Public Affairs Forum of India (PAFI), held on September 18–19, 2024 in New Delhi under the theme “India@2030 – Doubling the Economy to \$7 Trillion.” The forum convened parliamentarians, policymakers, corporate leaders, and policy professionals to deliberate on how policies, partnerships, and legislative priorities can drive India’s growth trajectory while ensuring inclusion.

Across sessions on Legislating for Growth, Jobs and Governance Strategies for 2030, and Telecom for Tomorrow, the forum highlighted how education-to-work transitions, digital infrastructure, and industry-aligned skilling must anchor India’s economic ambitions. For Svaniti, the deliberations reinforced our belief that policy design must connect macroeconomic aspirations with micro-level execution—where education, employability, and equitable access converge as enablers of sustainable development.



As part of the forum, Svaniti engaged in a thought-provoking exchange with Members of Parliament Shashank Mani, Manish Tewari, and Krishna Lavu. The discussion centered on bridging the structural gap between citizen aspirations and legislative design, noting that the scale of Indian constituencies often makes translating diverse local needs into national lawmaking uniquely complex.





UTTRAKHAND STATE EXPLORATION

As part of our ongoing effort to understand regional challenges and aspirations, Svaniti Policy Research Center undertook a field visit to Uttarakhand, with a special focus on the Kumaon region. Uttarakhand, located in the central Himalayas, is a state of striking natural beauty, with its geography marked by steep mountains, river valleys, and forested landscapes. While the state's economy relies heavily on tourism, its demographic trends reveal a pressing challenge—thousands of “ghost villages,” abandoned due to sustained out-migration in search of livelihoods, services, and education.

Our visit highlighted how aspirations in the region are shaped largely by economic realities, with tourism offering seasonal employment but limited long-term stability. Conversations with local residents deepened our understanding of the gaps in education infrastructure and access, particularly in rural and remote communities. The absence of strong educational institutions was repeatedly linked to migration, leaving behind villages with dwindling populations and broken community structures.

Yet, the region's potential is undeniable. Uttarakhand's unique cultural and spiritual identity positions it to become not just a tourism destination but a global hub for spiritual and holistic education. With strategic investment in quality educational institutions—integrating modern pedagogy with local ethos and sustainable livelihoods—there lies an opportunity to reverse migration by bringing back youth and families to their native villages. For Svaniti, these learnings reinforced the importance of region-specific education policy approaches, sensitive to local socio-economic contexts, and capable of transforming challenges into long-term opportunities for growth, resilience, and community renewal.



DIDAC INDIA '24

Svaniti Policy Research Center participated in DIDAC India 2024, the 14th edition of Asia's largest education and skills exhibition and conference, held on 18–20 September 2024 at Yashobhoomi, New Delhi. The event convened global educators, policymakers, and edtech providers, with more than 300 exhibitors from 20+ countries and 5000+ products and technologies spanning AI, robotics, AR/VR, infrastructure, and classroom solutions. Alongside the exhibition, the TIESS conference offered high-level sessions on policy, leadership, pedagogy, and technology integration, including discussions on NEP-aligned governance models, distributed leadership, and teaching in the age of AI.

For Svaniti, DIDAC reinforced the importance of industry partnerships and private-sector engagement in advancing the goals of India's education policy. While acknowledging the need to safeguard equity, the event highlighted how private innovation and socially inclusive startups can expand access and accelerate reforms envisioned under NEP 2020. By engaging with diverse stakeholders—from edtech providers to institutional leaders—our participation underscored the value of aligning education policy with technology-driven, scalable solutions while ensuring inclusivity for every learner.



IDEA POCKET

In 2024, the Svaniti Policy Research Center collaborated with the TEDxSurat community to share the transformative power of ideas with more than 1,100 participants. As a think tank driven by innovative concepts, Svaniti recognized that meaningful change starts with curiosity, reflection, and open dialogue. To capture this essence, our LifeSite Project team created and distributed 1,100 distinctive Idea Pockets.

Each pocket contained seven distinct ideas carefully curated to spark imagination, nurture wisdom, and inspire action. By crafting every pocket uniquely, we ensured that no two participants had the same experience—symbolizing the diversity of perspectives that drive innovation and social progress. The initiative reflected our belief that ideas should not remain confined to research tables but must be shared, spread, and lived by communities.

Through this partnership, Svaniti reinforced its commitment to shaping a culture where ideas serve as catalysts for individual growth and collective transformation.



Svaniti Policy Research Center participated in the Pune Public Policy Festival 2025, which convened leaders, policymakers, and practitioners across governance, economy, and social innovation. The event served as a platform for cross-sector dialogue and idea exchange on India's policy future. At the festival, Svaniti advanced its initiative on cultivating India's Creative Economy.

In a key interaction with Shri O. P. Choudhary, Finance Minister of Chhattisgarh, we presented our draft proposal identifying seven priority sectors and thirty-five industries capable of generating new employment opportunities and strengthening India's soft power. Recognizing the proposal's relevance, the Finance Minister assured that the report would be shared with the State Finance Secretary for consideration in the upcoming state budget deliberations.

Alongside this milestone, our team engaged in discussions with experts across multiple policy domains, further strengthening our networks and sharpening our insights. The experience underscored Svaniti's role as an idea-driven think tank—translating research into actionable policy and positioning the creative economy as a driver of both inclusive growth and global influence.





BENNETT UNIVERSITY IDEATHON

Svaniti Policy Research Center was invited to mentor and evaluate the first round of the Hult Ideathon hosted by Bennett University's Center for Innovation and Entrepreneurship (CIE). The Hult Ideathon is part of the global Hult Prize pipeline, offering undergraduate students a structured sprint to frame problem statements, validate solutions with users, and pitch social enterprise ideas aligned to the UN Sustainable Development Goals.

Our engagement provided an opportunity to explore a range of student-led startups and initiatives emerging from Bennett's vibrant entrepreneurial ecosystem. Ideas spanned diverse sectors, from music-driven education platforms and AI-based real estate solutions to fintech innovations in crypto and sustainable vegan leather alternatives. These ventures reflected both creativity and the determination of young entrepreneurs to address social and market needs.



In addition to mentoring student teams, Svaniti engaged in meaningful dialogue with faculty members and startup leaders at the Bennett Hatchery. Discussions centered on the need for a robust policy framework to support undergraduate entrepreneurship—highlighting challenges such as funding accessibility, curriculum integration, and pathways for students from diverse backgrounds to enter the startup ecosystem. Our conversations reinforced the importance of embedding entrepreneurship within early higher education, ensuring students are equipped with structured thinking, mentorship, and enabling policies to transform ideas into ventures.



ATLASSIAN FOR NONPROFITS

As part of our commitment to continuously enhance the role of technology in the development sector, Svaniti partnered with the Atlassian Community – Delhi Gurugram to explore innovative solutions for nonprofits. A highlight of the engagement was the panel discussion featuring Kiran DM and Dhananjay Ramakrishnappa, whose perspectives enriched the dialogue and broadened our understanding of the intersection between collaboration tools and social impact. The interaction reaffirmed our belief that technology, when tailored for nonprofit realities, can play a catalytic role in scaling impact, improving efficiency, and empowering communities.

Following this exchange, Svaniti explored avenues of collaboration with Atlassian to integrate their suite of tools into our own systems. This step reflects our effort to upgrade technologically and align with global best practices in nonprofit management. With Atlassian's tools, we aim to strengthen project management, enhance knowledge-sharing, and streamline collaboration across our initiatives—ultimately translating into greater capacity to serve communities and foster policy innovation. The session witnessed high energy, insightful participation, and meaningful discussions around the transformative role of technology in strengthening nonprofit ecosystems.



GOOD GOVERNANCE YATRA

Svaniti Policy Research Center participated in the Good Governance Yatra 2025, an intensive nine-day journey across Uttar Pradesh and Delhi, designed and curated by the Rashtram School of Public Leadership, Rishihood University. The Yatra introduced participants to the Good Governance Framework, rooted in Indic knowledge systems and contextual realities of Bharat. This framework provided us with a fresh lens to assess governance practices beyond conventional Western paradigms.



Our cohort engaged with senior policymakers, parliamentarians, administrators, and thought leaders, observing governance in action at multiple levels. From the 112 Emergency Response Headquarters in Lucknow to the Command and Control Center for the Mahakumbh in Prayagraj, we witnessed how technology, leadership, and community engagement converge in the service of citizens. Conversations with key figures—including Dr. Anirban Ganguly (SPMRF), Dr. Swapan Dasgupta (India Foundation), Shri Shantanu Gupta, Shri Alok Kumar (Principal Secretary, Planning, GoUP), and Shri Awanish Awasthi—enriched our understanding of both policy intent and implementation.



Svaniti also contributed to the Yatra by sharing our ongoing research on the Creative Economy of Uttar Pradesh. We mapped potential sectors and industries, evaluating their capacity to generate employment, foster innovation, and enhance cultural capital. This draft proposal was presented to Shri Asim Arun, Cabinet Minister in the Government of Uttar Pradesh, and discussed with other stakeholders, opening avenues for collaboration on policies that integrate economic growth with cultural and creative strengths.

WAY FORWARD

As we look ahead, SvaNiti Policy Research Center is committed to deepening and systematizing the work we have begun. In January 2026, we will launch the fourth flagship initiative — Viksit Bharat Darshan Yatra, a purpose-driven journey designed to nurture the next generation of leaders for nation-building. This Yatra, rooted in our philosophy of connecting personal purpose with collective progress, will provide youth with direct exposure to grassroots realities, culture, and governance, inspiring them to translate aspirations into impactful projects and policy ideas.

In parallel, 2026 will also mark the publication of the LifeSite Research Document, a comprehensive synthesis of insights from our seven-year pilot project. This document will serve as a blueprint for reimagining learning ecosystems that transcend traditional schooling, combining Indic values with contemporary needs to inspire educational reform and reverse migration in underserved regions.

For the Sva-Bharat Movement, our priority will be to formalize the model as a CSR-ready project, enabling wider participation and sustained funding. We will initiate the appointment of Campus Ambassadors and invite Regional Ambassadors from across India to build a robust network of idea-driven citizens who can aggregate and channel local aspirations into actionable policy proposals.

We also aim to ideate and prototype a technology-driven public policy platform, harnessing AI and digital infrastructure to solve real-world policy problems and impact livelihoods at scale. This will strengthen our capacity to bridge citizen voice with governance systems, leveraging technology as a force-multiplier for inclusion and impact.



Collectively, these steps will ensure that SvaNiti continues to be a catalyst for people-centered policy innovation, translating grassroots energy into governance solutions that contribute to Viksit Bharat 2047.
